#### Storm Radar



Once you open this app, the main page is a full screen live radar listing any kind of precipitation that may be headed your way. It also gives a quick temperature reading, chance of precipitation and wind speed.

### Bean Cam



This is one app I have not yet had the opportunity to use simply because it's been the most recent addition to my

iPhone. I heard about this app while attending the 2019 Southwest Ag Conference. This app aids in the decision making process of whether or not you should replant your soybean crop. With a few quick stand counts, the app will calculate yield percentage at the current populations and suggest if a replant is warranted.

## Ag PhD Fertilizer Removal



2018 was a year that saw record soybean yields. But with record yields comes record nutrient removal. This app uses crop removal rates from the International Plant Nutrition Institute (IPNI), which allows you to see crop removal rates for various crop yields. It can be used as a great starting point to see what your crop needs to meet its full potential.

## Pest Manager



I find myself using this app for a quick infield reference. On this app, you have the ability to look up different pests (insects, weeds and diseases) at different stages of development.
